Host Family Coordinator

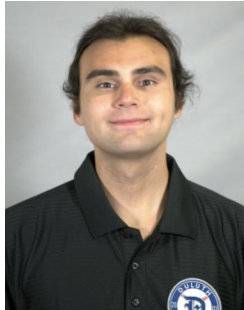

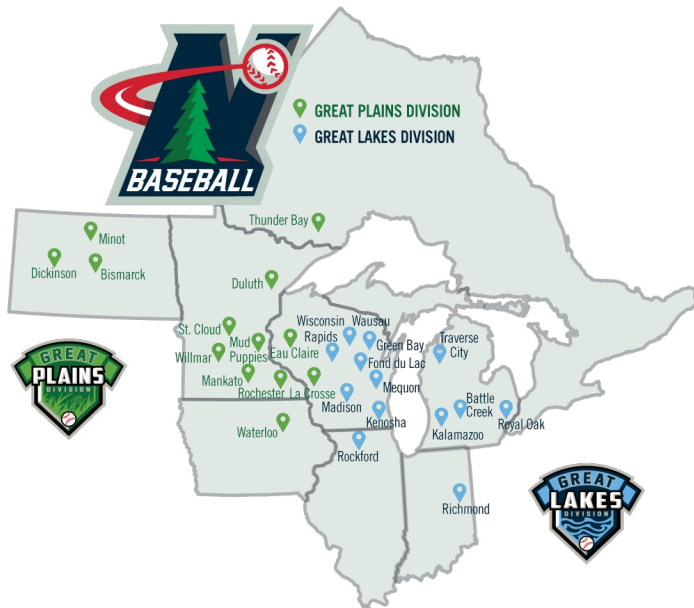

DUNE COAST BASEBALL JOINS IN 2027

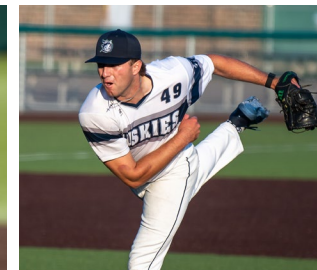

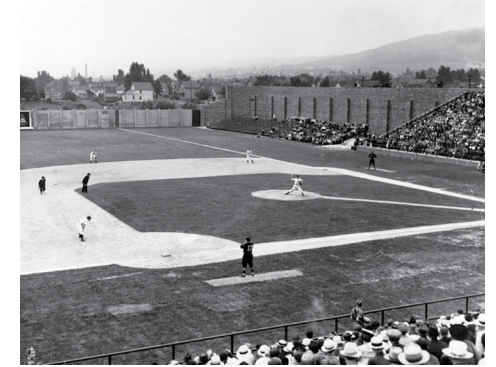
WADE STADIUM AND ITS PLACE IN TWIN PORTS HISTORY

Before the Huskies we know and love, there were the Duluth Dukes. Before Historic Wade Stadium, there was the Athletic Park. The year was 1938, and the park was in dire need of replacement, so the Citywide All-Sports Stadium Committee went to work collecting over 7,000 signatures of support on a petition for a \$75,000 bond to build what would be known as the "All-Sports Stadium," according to the archives in zenithcity.com. The bond would be approved that year, and a newly established Public Stadium Advisory committee got to work on site planning. This committee included the former owner of the Duluth Eskimos and Minnesota Vikings, Olaf Haugrud.

When the project was all said and done, the total cost was \$230,880. For context, the same stadium fans sat in in 1941 would cost more than \$4.6 million to build in 2022 (and that doesn't factor in any of the modern amenities we have today)! Grand Avenue may be a block away, but more than 380,000 paving bricks from the road's reconstruction were used in the making of the Duluth Municipal All-Sports Stadium, the ballpark's name at the time, ensuring that part in Duluth's history would remain in the city's western neighborhood. The Duluth Dukes would call this stadium home, and on July 16, 1941, they would play their first home game against the Superior Blues, a 6-3 loss.

On February 3, 1954, the stadium was renamed Wade Municipal Stadium after its longtime owner, Frank Wade. The Dukes played with various major league affiliates throughout the 1950's and 1960's, including the Cincinnati Redlegs, The Chicago White Sox, and the Detroit Tigers. By the end of the 1960's, the team was once again affiliated with the White Sox, but Chicago dropped its affiliation with Duluth due to financial



struggles, marking the end of the Dukes' major league sponsorships.

Wade Stadium continued to host high school and college baseball teams in the 70's and 80's, and even hosted marquee concerts, including the Beach Boys, Three Dog Night, and Willie Nelson all rocking the Wade in 1983.

The stadium saw a half million-dollar renovation come in the early 1990's, and after the Dukes moved to Kansas City in 2002, the Duluth Huskies of the Northwoods League would call the Wade home. Between 2014 and 2015 another \$4.6 million dollars were put into reviving the Wade once more. The project included a new drainage system and artificial turf placed in the field, new scoreboard and light installation, reconfiguring the concessions and press box, and adding ticket stalls, according to zenithcity.com. The right-field wall was reconstructed after a 2013 collapse, and the entire stadium was given revitalization, some of which was done by volunteers! Today, the stadium remains a staple of the Twin Ports and home to high school, college, and Northwoods League athletics alike.

ABOUT WADE STADIUM

Historic Wade Municipal Stadium was built in 1941 and opened its gates on July 16 of that year. The original name of the ballpark was Municipal All Sports Stadium. The city renamed it Wade Stadium in 1954 after Frank Wade.

The wall surrounding the ballpark is made of 381,000 bricks taken from Grand Avenue after the street was torn up in 1940.

Here are some rules and policies to make your visit to Wade Stadium more enjoyable:

ALCOHOL REGULATIONS

Law prohibits the sale of alcoholic beverages to intoxicated persons. Patrons purchasing alcohol must be 21 years of age and must provide proof of legal age. All patrons wishing to purchase alcohol must secure a wristband in order to purchase alcohol. Wristbands are available on the main concourse. The sale of alcoholic beverages will stop at the end of the 9th inning or 10 p.m., whichever comes first.

ANIMALS

With the exception of "Bark in the Park," animals are not allowed at Wade Stadium unless it is a service animal with verifiable paperwork.

CONDUCT

Huskies management reserves the right to revoke tickets of any patrons using obscene or abusive language, exhibiting inappropriate behavior, or that appear to be intoxicated. Fans who enter the playing field or interfere with the play of the game are also subject to removal from the stadium.

FIRST AID

Fans needing first aid or other medical assistance should locate any staff member. For emergency medical service, please contact any staff member inside the stadium or the main concourse.

FOUL BALLS

Fans are encouraged to keep any baseball thrown or batted into the stands. However, please be aware of any ball or bat leaving play and entering the stands. Fans should be alert to the danger at all times. The Huskies are NOT RESPONSIBLE for any injuries resulting from such accidents.

LOST AND FOUND

Lost and found items should be taken to the main concourse.

LOST CHILDREN

Lost children will be taken to the main concourse. If separated from a child, inform any staff member and report to the main concourse.

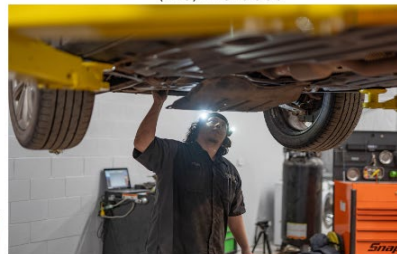

NWL PACE OF PLAY RULES WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The NWL uses clock guidelines based on college rules, which are different from the rules used by Minor League and Major League Baseball. Here is an overview of what fans can expect:

:20 Action Clock:

- Clock starts when umpire signals "play" except during an at-bat when the ball remains alive, clock will start when pitcher receives the ball and is on the mound
- With runners on base, defensive team allowed one reset per at bat (pitcher fakes a throw to base or steps off the mound)
- No defensive reset with bases empty unless umpire grants time
- Batter requesting "time" for other than legitimate reason is charged an offensive conference (teams allowed 3 per game)

:30 Mound Visit Clock

If no pitching change, coach must leave the mound before or when the timer expires.

Other Timing Considerations

- 2:30 pitching change clock
- 2:00 between-innings clock (if pitching change to start inning, pitcher will be allowed 8 warm-up pitches)

Violations on the defensive team will result in a ball being added to the count. Violations on the offensive team will result in a strike being added to the count.

FORMER HUSKIES DRAFTED

SIX ALUMNI SELECTED IN 2025 MLB DRAFT

The Duluth Huskies are proud to announce that six alumni have been selected in the 2025 Major League Baseball Draft. These players made a lasting impact at Wade Stadium and have continued to develop into standout performers at the collegiate level and beyond.

Brandon Compton – 2nd Round,
46th Overall – Miami Marlins

Compton was a force during the 2023 season with the Huskies, earning Great Plains All-Star honors after hitting .320 across 60 games with 17 doubles, 13 home runs, and 71 RBIs. He returned to Arizona State for his sophomore and junior seasons, continuing to showcase his power and polish at the plate. As a freshman in 2024, he was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year after leading all conference freshmen in home runs (14), doubles (16), and batting average. Over two seasons with the Sun Devils, Compton hit .310 with 23 home runs and 105 RBIs. Last month at the MLB Draft Combine, he recorded the top three exit velocities ever tracked since its inception.

Murf Gray – Competitive Balance Round B,
73rd Overall – Pittsburgh Pirates

Gray had a brief stint with the Huskies in 2023, appearing in three games and hitting .300 across 10 at-bats before his summer was cut short due to injury. He returned to Fresno State and continued

to build on an already impressive collegiate career. In his junior season, Gray hit .324 with 18 home runs and 73 RBIs, solidifying his status as one of the nation's top infielders. Over three years with the Bulldogs, he earned numerous accolades, including 2023 Mountain West Freshman of the Year, 2024 Mountain West Championship MVP, 2025 All-Mountain West First Team, and a second consecutive Championship MVP in 2025.

Lucas Kelly – 6th Round,
182nd Overall – Seattle Mariners

Kelly spent parts of two seasons with the Huskies, showcasing his versatility as a two-way player. In 2023, he appeared in 34 games primarily as a designated hitter, driving in 15 runs. He returned to Duluth in 2024 and made two appearances on the mound, striking out four batters over 2.0 hitless, scoreless innings. This spring, the Arizona State right-hander emerged as a key bullpen piece, striking out 34 over 26.2 innings of relief. Kelly has quickly developed into a high-upside arm with a big frame and rising velocity that has turned heads in a short amount of time.

JD McReynolds – 10th Round,
295th Overall – Texas Rangers

McReynolds was a key bullpen arm for the Huskies during the second half of the 2022 season, striking out 20 batters over 12.2 innings while

allowing just five hits and posting a 3.55 ERA. He continued to thrive in relief at Central Missouri, finishing his collegiate career with a dominant 2025 season—throwing 57.1 innings, striking out 95, recording a 0.87 WHIP, and giving up only nine earned runs. His efforts helped the Mules reach the NCAA Division II Championship Series and earned him a 10th-round selection by the Texas Rangers.

Cardell Thibodeaux – 16th Round,
490th Overall – San Diego Padres

Cardell Thibodeaux spent the entire 2024 season with the Duluth Huskies, appearing in 60 games and hitting .243 with 21 extra-base hits and 23 stolen bases. He shined in the postseason, going 3-for-7 with 3 RBIs in the Huskies' playoff series against La Crosse. Following the summer, Thibodeaux transferred to Southern University, where he had a breakout season – batting .439 with 18 home runs and 71 RBIs. He finished

the year ranked first in Division I in slugging percentage (.847) and second in the nation in batting average. His dominant performance earned him SWAC Player of the Year and SWAC Newcomer of the Year honors.

Jonathan Vastine – 19th Round,
580th Overall – San Diego Padres

A key contributor during the Duluth Huskies' 2022 season, Jonathan Vastine appeared in 43 games, batting .295 with 18 stolen bases while helping lead the team to a Northwoods League Championship appearance. He brought that same spark to Vanderbilt University, where he spent four years as a reliable presence in the Commodores' lineup. Vastine delivered several standout moments during his college career, including a walk-off home run against Kentucky this past May. Heading into the 2025 season, he was ranked the top senior shortstop in the country by Perfect Game.

NWL PITCHING GUIDELINES

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

In an effort to most liken the Northwoods League to the entry levels of Professional Baseball the League has implemented the following pitching guidelines:

days of rest prior to making an appearance in a game as a pitcher.

A pitcher:

- Cannot begin a new inning after throwing 100 pitches or more.
- Cannot face a new batter after throwing 110 pitches or more. In the event a starting pitcher has not allowed a hit, he will not be allowed to begin a new inning after throwing 120 pitches or more.

If a pitcher throws 35 or more pitches in one inning, he will not be allowed to return for the next inning or the remainder of the game.

A pitcher cannot make appearances in more than two consecutive days. The official scorer will have final say with regard to pitch counts.

Following an appearance in which a pitcher throws:

- 100 or more pitches, he must have five full days of rest prior to his next appearance in a game.
- Between 85-99 pitches, he must have four full days of rest prior to making an appearance in a game.
- 50 pitches or more he must have two full

A game in which a team(s) is in violation of the Pitching Guidelines shall result in the win from that game being removed and replaced with a loss for the offending team(s). The non-offending team will have their loss taken away but they will not be given a win.

All statistics from the game will remain with the exception of the WON/LOSS record.

NWL EXTRA INNINGS RULE

For all regular season games but not including playoff games, all extra innings (which are defined as beginning in the 10th inning and each subsequent inning of the game thereafter) will begin with a runner on second base. The runner at second base will be the player in the batting order position previous to the leadoff batter of the inning (or a substitute for that player).

For example, if the number five hitter in the batting order is due to lead off the 10th inning, the number four player in the batting order (or a pinch-runner for such player) shall

begin the inning on second base. Any runner or batter removed from the game for a substitute shall be ineligible to return to the game, as is the case in all circumstances under official playing rules.

For purposes of calculating earned runs, the runner who begins an inning on second base per this rule shall be deemed to be a runner who has reached second base because of a fielding error, but no error shall be charged to the opposing team or to any player. The loss in such extra-inning games still counts against the pitcher.

NWL PLAYOFF INFORMATION/FORMAT:

PLAYOFF DATES: Sunday, August 9 – Thursday, August 13, 2026 (if a weather or travel day is needed, the playoffs may be extended to Friday, August 14).

PLAYOFF FORMAT:

1. The two playoff eligible Teams in each sub-division will compete in a best of three Sub-Divisional Series. The Team with the best overall winning percentage will have home field advantage. The Sub-Divisional Series shall be a 1-2 format (with home field advantage hosting Game 2 and Game 3). If both of the best of three Sub-Divisional Series ends in two consecutive days, the resulting Divisional Championship Game will be played the following day.
2. The two Sub-Divisional Series winners will play a one-game Divisional Championship Game. Home field advantage for the Divisional Championship Game will go to the Team with the best overall record.
3. The two Divisional Game winners will play a one-game League Championship. Home field advantage for the League Championship Game will go to the Team with the best overall record.
4. In the event a "travel day" is needed to accommodate play between the Divisional and League Championship Game, the President, in his or her sole discretion, may add in a travel day before the League Championship Game.

Section 5. A tie breaker will be used when teams have an identical winning percentage for a half season or a full season in determining home field advantage or sub-divisional champion for that respective half season. The tie breaker is as follows for determining a sub-divisional half season champion, sub-divisional home field advantage, or divisional home field advantage:

1. Overall head to head winning percentage
2. For sub-divisional standings and series: Winning percentage vs. the next highest placed team in sub-division, using overall record, and so on throughout sub-division. If a Team has not played against the highest placed Team in the sub-division or any subsequent Team, then the Team's record versus the next highest placed Team will be used.
3. For Divisional Championship Game: Winning percentage vs. teams in the other sub-division. And, if still tied; The team whose opponents in the other sub-division had the highest overall, combined winning percentage.

2025 ALL NWL ALUMNI TEAM:

Catcher: Drake Baldwin – Atlanta Braves – K-Town 2020, Madison 2021

Baldwin began the season as the backup but broke out in tremendous fashion in May, batting .389 with 21 Hits, three Home Runs and nine RBI. Named to the MLB All-Rookie 1st Team and awarded the NL Rookie of the Year - the first catcher to earn the award since 2010.

1st Base: Pete Alonso – New York Mets – Madison 2014

On August 12th, he hit the 253rd Home Run of his career, passing Darryl Strawberry for the Mets All-Time Home Run record. Pete was 1 of only 6 players that participated in all 162 games of the season and was awarded with the first Silver Slugger Award of his career.

2nd Base: Nico Hoerner – Chicago Cubs – Madison 2016

Nico had an incredible .297 with seven Home Runs, 61 RBI, 89 Runs Scored, while adding 29 Stolen Bases, and lead all MLB 2nd Basemen in Hits (178) and in Batting Average. He also ranked first amongst all 2nd Basemen in Defensive Runs Saved (17), Outs Above Average (14) and was second in Defensive Wins Above Replacement and was recognized with the 2nd Gold Glove Award of his career.

3rd Base: Zach McKinsty – Detroit Tigers – Waterloo 2015

In his 6th MLB season, he played every position besides Catcher and Center Field for the Tigers, mostly at 3rd Base with 85 appearances. He was selected to his 1st MLB All-Star Game of his career. He led all MLB 3rd Basemen with 11 Triples and finished Top 10 in Runs Scored, Stolen Bases and Average, and received his first Silver Slugger Award, winning the Utility position for the AL.

Shortstop: Jacob Wilson – Athletics – Mankato 2021

Selected to the MLB All-Star Game as the AL's starting Shortstop - the first Athletics shortstop to earn a start in the All-Star Game in over 50 years. He battled injuries in the 2nd Half but finished his Rookie campaign with a .311 Batting Average, 13 Home Runs, 63 RBI and 62 Runs Scored. He was named to the MLB All-Rookie 1st Team and finished 2nd in American League Rookie of the Year voting.

Outfield: Daulton Varsho – Toronto Blue Jays – Eau Claire 2015, 2016

In an injury-shortened 71 games, he crushed 20 Home Runs, 55 RBI, 43 Runs scored and 13 Doubles. Recorded 49 putouts in the post-season, 11 more than any other Outfielder. In Game 2 of the ALDS vs. the Yankees, two Home Runs, two Doubles and four RBI, made him the 5th Toronto player with a multi-Home Run game in Franchise history.

Outfield: Harrison Bader – Philadelphia Phillies – Lakeshore 2013

He started with the Minnesota Twins. In 96 games he hit .258, with 12 Home Runs, 38 RBI, 13 Doubles and 10 Stolen Bases. At the trade deadline, went to playoff-contending Philadelphia, and had a .305 Batting Average, 11 Doubles, five Home Runs and 16 RBI over 50 games with his new team. He finished with the most Home Runs (17) in his career, as well as reaching career-high marks in RBI (54), Runs (61), Hits (124) and Batting Average (.277).

Outfield: TJ Friedl – Cincinnati Reds – St. Cloud 2016

As the everyday Centerfielder in Cincinnati, playing in 152 games, the former Rox star recorded career-high totals in Runs, Hits (151), At-Bats (579), Doubles and Walks (81), which were the 8th most walks recorded by an Outfielder in MLB this season. Friedl would help lead the Reds back to the MLB Playoffs for the first time in a full-length season since 2013.

Utility: Michael Busch – Chicago Cubs – St. Cloud 2017

Busch was one of the best sluggers in baseball, finishing Top 10 among all 1st Basemen in Home Runs, RBI and Hits. The former 1st Round pick set career highs in Hits (137), Triples (5), Home Runs (34), RBI (90) and Batting Average (.261) and led the Cubs Playoff run with four Home Runs. In the NLDS he was the first player in MLB history to hit multiple lead-off Home Runs in the same post-season.

Honorable Mention: Ernie Clement – Toronto Blue Jays – Wisconsin Rapids 2015

With a .277 Batting Average, he finished in the Top 5 in Runs Scored, Hits, Doubles and Batting Average among qualified 3rd Basemen. He hit an eye-popping .643 in the ALDS vs. the Yankees. He set a new MLB Post-Season record with 30 hits and was nominated for two Gold Glove Awards (3rd Base and Utility). He led all 3rd Basemen in Defensive Wins Above Replacement (dWAR).

Honorable Mention: Matt Chapman – San Francisco Giants – La Crosse 2012

The 5-time Gold Glove winner continued to provide his elite defense at the hot corner, combined with his reliable power numbers at the dish in his 9th MLB season. The former Logger and Northwoods League Champion hit his 200th career Home Run on August 28th vs. the Cubs and recorded his 1,000th career Hit on September 26th vs. the Rockies.

Honorable Mention: Caleb Durbin – Milwaukee Brewers – Rockford 2019, Fond du Lac 2020, 2021

From D3 collegiate baseball to one of the best Rookies in MLB. In 136 games his rookie season, he finished with a .256 Batting Average, 11 Home Runs, 53 RBI, 60 Runs, 114 Hits and 18 Stolen Bases - and was Top 10 among all Rookies in Runs, Hits, Doubles, Home Runs, RBI, Stolen Bases and Extra-Base Hits. Named to the MLB All-Rookie 1st Team, and finished 3rd in the NL Rookie of the Year voting.

Honorable Mention: Jakob Marsee – Miami Marlins – Great Lakes 2020, Kokomo 2021, Traverse City 2022

He made his debut with the Marlins on August 1st - walking three times, scoring twice and recording his first career hit, making him the first player since 1924 to hit a double and walk three times in their MLB Debut. He was nominated to the MLB All-Rookie 1st Team and finished 8th in NL Rookie of the Year voting.

Earlier this year, the Northwoods League named their 2025 MLB Alumni Team.

Their MLB team and NWL team year(s) and are listed below:

Honorable Mention: Kyle Manzardo – Cleveland Guardians – Willmar 2020

Kyle owned a .256 Average with 12 Home Runs and 33 RBI in the final 60 Games of the regular season. The former 2nd Round Pick was one of the best young hitters in all of baseball, finishing 2nd in the Cleveland offense in Home Runs and RBI, while finishing 3rd in Hits.

Pitchers: Chris Sale – Atlanta Braves – La Crosse 2008

Sale led the Braves with 165 Strikeouts over 125.2 Innings Pitched, averaging 11.9 Strikeouts per 9 Innings, a trademark of his career. He registered the 2,500th Strikeout of his career (the 40th pitcher in MLB history to reach this milestone) and was the fastest pitcher to reach 2,500 Strikeouts in a career, breaking Randy Johnson's record by almost 100 innings.

Pitchers: Spencer Schwellenbach – Atlanta Braves – Traverse City 2020

In his first three starts of 2025, he struck out 19 Batters across 20 Innings, allowing only one Run. He threw the first Complete Game of his career vs. the Brewers. In spite of an arm injury, he logged 110.2 Innings with 108 Strikeouts, and a 3.09 ERA, while only walking 18 batters.

Noah Cameron – Kansas City Royals – Willmar 2020

He threw 138.1 Innings with the Royals, striking out 114 batters with a 2.99 ERA. becoming the 3rd Royals rookie to record a sub-3.00 ERA over 20 Starts in their franchise history. He led all Rookie pitchers in Wins Above Replacement (WAR), finished 2nd in ERA, 5th in Innings Pitched and 6th in Strikeouts. He was named to the MLB All-Rookie 1st Team and finished 4th in AL Rookie of the Year voting.

Alex Vesia – Los Angeles Dodgers – Mankato 2016

With 68 Appearances and five Saves, he struck out 80 batters across 59.2 Innings Pitched. As a late-inning reliever he limited batters to an amazing .181 Batting Average in 2025. He made seven relief appearances during the Dodgers Playoff run, earning a 2nd World Series ring.

Louis Varland – Toronto Blue Jays – Willmar 2017, 2018

The RHP owned an amazing 2.02 ERA over 49 Innings Pitched, striking out 47 batters over that span with Minnesota. He was traded to the playoff-contending Toronto Blue Jays, setting career-high marks with 22 Holds, 72.2 Innings Pitched, 75 Strikeouts and a 2.97 ERA and was an integral part of the Blue Jays run to the World Series. In Game 7 of the World Series, his 2/3 Inning made MLB history for the most Appearances by a Pitcher (15) in the Post-Season.

Pitchers: Will Warren – New York Yankees – St. Cloud 2018

Warren finished the year with a 9-8 Record, 4.44 ERA, striking out 171 batters over 162.1 Innings Pitched. His 33 Starts on the mound were the most by an MLB rookie pitcher in 17 years and tied for 2nd most in the entire MLB. He led all rookie pitchers in Starts, Innings Pitched and Strikeouts. He was selected to Baseball America's All-Rookie Team and finished 8th in AL Rookie of the Year voting.

Pitchers: Tanner Banks – Philadelphia Phillies – Willmar 2011, 2012

Banks led all Phillies relievers with 67.1 Innings Pitched, punching out 61 batters, registering a 3.07 ERA, and adding a save to his campaign. He was 3rd in the Philadelphia bullpen with 10 Holds, and he was elite when facing left-handed batters, limiting them to a .175 Batting Average.

Pitchers: Greg Weissert – Boston Red Sox – Thunder Bay 2015

He finished 3rd on Boston with 17 Holds, and four Saves, finished 6th on Boston in Innings Pitched and 7th in Strikeouts; impressive for a player whose longest appearance was only two-innings. He made the first MLB Playoff appearance of his career, throwing a scoreless inning of relief vs. the Yankees in Game 3 of the AL Wild Card series.

Pitchers: Chad Patrick – Milwaukee Brewers – Traverse City 2019, 2020

He transitioned between the starting rotation and bullpen, finishing with a 3-8 Record, 3.53 ERA, striking out 127 batters over 119.2 Innings Pitched. In the post-season, he made six appearances, striking out 11 batters over 9.0 innings, allowing a mere two runs, and was named to MLB's All-Rookie 2nd Team and finished 7th in NL Rookie of the Year voting.

Pitchers/Honorable Mention: John Schreiber – Kansas City Royals – Kalamazoo 2014

He logged a 3-3 Record, striking out 62 batters across 64 Innings, totaling a 3.80 ERA and added a save to his campaign. As a reliever, he finished Top 10 on the Royals pitching staff in Strikeouts and Innings Pitched, He limited opponents to a notable .234 batting average, the second-best mark of his career.

Pitchers/Honorable Mention: Matt Strahm – Philadelphia Phillies – Rochester 2011

Finished with a 2-3 Record, 2.74 ERA over 62.1 Innings Pitched, and a career-high six Saves. Strahm impressively struck out over 25% of the batters he faced. He made three post-season appearances out of the bullpen in the NLDS, allowing one Run over 2.1 Innings Pitched.

Pitchers/Honorable Mention: Kyle Leahy – St. Louis Cardinals – Waterloo 2016, 2017

Out of the bullpen, set a career-high 62 Appearances, 88 Innings Pitched, 80 Strikeouts, 18 Holds, four Wins, while maintaining an impressive 3.07 ERA.
