



Youth Baseball/Softball Equipment Grant Program

The Northwoods League Foundation ("Foundation") is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization that serves as a vehicle to transform a shared passion for baseball into positive change and support for communities. The Mission of the Northwoods League Foundation is: To utilize the game of baseball to enrich the quality of life for children and families with an enduring and caring focus on Northwoods League communities.

In support of this mission, the Foundation will be awarding equipment grants to youth baseball and softball organizations across the twenty-six (26) Northwoods League communities.

What is the grant?

The grant is a standardized set of Rawlings youth equipment. There will be both baseball grants and softball grants awarded. Each grant includes:

Baseball Grant

- (1) Set of Catcher's Gear
(helmet, chest protector, shin guards, mitt)
- (6) batting helmets
- (9) Fielding gloves (7 right, 2 left)
- (1) bucket of practice baseballs
- (3) bats (1-27", 1-28", 1-29")

Softball Grant

- (1) Set of Catcher's Gear
(helmet, chest protector, shin guards, mitt)
- (6) batting helmets
- (9) Fielding gloves (8 right, 2 left)
- (1) bucket of practice softballs
- (3) bats (1-27", 1-28", 1-29")

Who is eligible to receive the grant?

The following criteria must be met in order to be eligible to receive the grant:

1. Organization qualifies, or would qualify, as a 501(c)(3) organization, school or school-based program, or community-based organization *as defined under US IRC section 501(c)(3)*;
2. Organization is not an individual, for-profit business, political, or religious organization;
3. Organization provides opportunities for kids ages 9-12 to play baseball or softball within a community that is served by a Northwoods League affiliate.

How will grant applications be accepted and awarded?

Affiliate teams will be accepting grant applications from organizations within their community. The Foundation will not directly accept applications. Please contact your local Northwoods League team for information on application materials and deadlines. The Foundation has designated which communities will be awarded softball grants and which communities will be awarded baseball grants (please note that some markets will be awarding multiple grants this year). They are as follows:

Softball Grants: Battle Creek, MI; Fond du Lac, WI; Grand Forks, ND; Green Bay, WI; Kalamazoo, MI; Kenosha, WI; Lakeshore, WI; Madison, WI; Rockford, IL; Royal Oak, MI; Traverse City, MI; Wausau, WI; Wisconsin Rapids, WI.

Baseball Grants: Bismarck, ND; Dickinson, ND; Duluth, MN; Eau Claire, WI; La Crosse, WI; Mankato, MN; Minot, ND; Richmond, IN; Rochester, MN; St. Cloud, MN; Thunder Bay, ONT*; Waterloo, IA; Willmar, MN.

The Foundation will make the final determination on the awarding of grants. Grant recipients will be notified by their local Affiliate.
